

New Journals

To further improve access to economic research, the AEA expanded its publication program by launching four new journals in 2009. The quarterly *American Economic Journals (AEJs)* are included as part of the AEA subscription package of seven journals. All four new journals are peer reviewed and include data appendices and comments online.

American Economic Journal: Applied Economics® focuses on empirical microeconomic issues. Examples of subject matter include labor economics; empirical corporate finance; demography; development microeconomics; and health, education, and welfare economics.

American Economic Journal: Economic Policy® publishes papers covering a range of subjects, the common theme being the role of economic policy in economic outcomes. Subject areas include public economics; urban and regional economics; public policy aspects of health, education, welfare, and political institutions; law and economics; regulation; and natural resource economics.

American Economic Journal: Macroeconomics® focuses on studies of aggregate fluctuations and growth, and the role of policy in that context. Such studies often borrow from and interact with research in other fields such as monetary theory, industrial organization, finance, labor economics, political economy, public finance, international economics, and development economics.

American Economic Journal: Microeconomics® publishes papers on microeconomic theory, industrial organization, and the microeconomic aspects of international trade, political economy, and finance. The journal publishes theoretical work, as well as empirical and experimental work with a theoretical framework.

AEA Journals



The *American Economic Review*® (*AER*), first published in 1911, is among the nation's oldest and most cited scholarly journals in economics. Six regular issues contain peer-reviewed articles on a broad range of topics. Data appendices for most recent articles are freely available on the *AER* website: www.aeaweb.org/AER. An additional Papers and Proceedings issue in May presents selected papers from the AEA's annual meeting, along with the reports of officers and committees.



The *Journal of Economic Literature*® (*JEL*) was designed in 1969 to help economists keep abreast of the vast flow of economics literature. *JEL* issues contain commissioned, peer-reviewed survey and review articles, book reviews, an annotated bibliography of new books classified by subject matter, and an annual index of dissertations in North American universities. Until 2000, *JEL* issues included bibliographic indexes of current periodicals, now included only in *EconLit*. See www.aeaweb.org/JEL.



The *Journal of Economic Perspectives*® (*JEP*) was introduced in 1987. *JEP*'s mission is to publish articles that will serve several goals: synthesize and integrate lessons learned from active lines of economic research; provide economic analysis of public policy issues; encourage cross-fertilization of ideas among the fields of thinking; offer readers an accessible source for state-of-the-art economic thinking; suggest directions for future research; provide insights and readings for classroom use; and address issues relating to the economics profession. *JEP* articles are commissioned. Comments on online articles may appear on the article pages. See www.aeaweb.org/JEP.

Subscriptions to AEA Journals

Institutional Subscriptions

Libraries, institutions, firms, and other organizations may subscribe to the AEA journals. Institutional print subscriptions and online site licenses include all seven AEA journals. Online site licenses may be added to print subscriptions, or they may be ordered without print.

Online subscriptions include the *AER* and *JEL* from 1999, and *JEP* since 1987, and the four new journals from 2009 forward. As long as the subscription is active, it includes all the online issues. Institutions with current print subscriptions to AEA journals may add an electronic subscription immediately or may wait until their renewal date to activate online access. A single online site license may be added to one print subscription even though an institution may have multiple print subscriptions; the online subscription expires when the print subscription expires. Institutions may also subscribe to online journals without a print subscription. (See ordering information opposite.)

Additional Online Access Options

EBSCO Publishing provides the AEA journals on the searchable bibliographic database, *EconLit with Full Text*. (See www.ebscohost.com.) All seven AEA journals are available in *EconLit with Full Text* with no embargo period.

Archived full-text issues of the AEA journals are available after two years on EBSCOHost, JSTOR, and ProQuest platforms.

The AEA participates in the Portico archive of electronic scholarly journals and its post-cancellation access service.

AEA Online Full-Text Journal Subscription Terms and Conditions

The site license to access the AEA journals terminates when a subscription expires. Sites are defined as campuses within a six-mile radius as well as authorized remote users accessing the online journals through the campus IP address. Remote campuses beyond a six-mile radius must purchase a separate subscription regardless of the location of the administration.

The AEA is committed to maintaining low annual institutional subscription prices for its journals, which currently average only \$65 per journal for print and \$105 per journal for electronic only.
